

Vignacourt

Anzac Day approaches Vignacourt again and preparations are again underway for commemorations. This year a full range of activities will be offered. A wonderful display of artifacts will be on show for visitors. On Saturday the 21st the commemoration will take place with a march from the House of the Australians to the Vignacourt cemetery where wreaths will be laid .The march will then return to the Thuillier House where the new Vignacourt Museum will be open for visitors. In the afternoon the inaugural Vignacourt Cricket Test Match will take place. Teams from Lille and Arras will take on an Aussie team. On the evening of the 21st a commemorative Mass will take place in St Fermin's Church led by the Archbishop of Amiens and clergy from around the world. Voices of Birrilee Choir will provide musical accompaniment and a concert at a later stage. The official opening ceremony of the new museum will take place on the 4th July. On Sunday the 22nd of April the annual Anzac Run will take place with over 500 runners from across the Somme running in remembrance. Afterwards the great Aussie BBQ complete with sausages and beer take over Vignacourt. 11 Aussies will join us in commemoration for 2018.

We are also very excited to announce that a team of 15 runners from Vignacourt will visit Australia in November to take part in the Armistice Day run to be held in Bundaberg...the friendship city

twinned with Vignacourt. Stay tuned for more about this wonderful opportunity and experience. Runners from the local region will take part with the Frenchmen and women in this commemorative event.

- Just outside Vignacourt are the remains of at least 3, V1 and V2 rocket launching pads from WW2. (really easy to find)

- Rome is the 8th most populous city in Europe in city limits...2.8 million.
- Did you know the story of Pinnochio originated in Tuscany?
- Santorini sits in a huge crater left by a volcanic eruption that ended Minoan civilization on Crete.
